### MOVING FORWARD

### Teacher Take Wing

The Teacher Take Wing program is designed in an effort to provide funds to our local educators for creative projects, equipment, and learning materials to enhance the educational experience of our city's students. The 2019 committee reports outstanding participation in this year's grant cycle. Applications were received from sixty-six applicants representing eleven school districts and hundreds of students across the greater Texarkana area. Districts included TISD, TASD, Pleasant Grove, Liberty Eylau, Fouke, St. James, Redwater, Trinity, Genoa, and Leary. From the pool of outstanding and creative grant proposals, forty winners were chosen. Materials requested by the teachers included Legos, bristle blocks, classroom libraries, audio-visual equipment, musical instruments, STEAM stations, Dash Robots, Speros, science lab equipment, and supplies for an aquaponics project.

Winners of the grants, were honored at the November 5th general meeting held at Texarkana Arkansas Convention Center. The night began with a social, including dinner, provided by Off the Fire. During the Awards Ceremony, several teachers and their students spoke about their projects as they were awarded their checks. In all, \$14,669 was awarded for various classroom projects. The ceremony concluded with door prizes being given to very deserving teachers. Shout out to Jason and Becky Williams for donating dinner for two to Benchmark. The 2019 TTW committee included Jeanna Morris, Emily Ransom, Kelsey Kuhn and Stephanie Adcock.

### Shoes for the Soul/Clothes for a Cause



On Saturday, March 30th, 72 students from twenty local elementary schools came to Target at Richmond Road to shop with over 35 Junior League volunteers. Each student had thirty dollars allocated for clothing, along with an additional thirty dollars allocated for shoes. This is a worthwhile and enjoyable experience for students in need of community assistance. Of those 72 children, every single child left with a smile on their face and a new appreciation of what volunteer work can look like in their community.
